### **A BREATH OF FRESHAR** GREENS PUSH FOR LOWER POLLUTION ACROSS THE CITY



Green Party councillors have secured a **Clean Air Zone** for the city centre, and are pushing for fewer idling engines and more low-emission transport. Main roads like **Ecclesall Road** and **Abbeydale Road** run through our area and junctions are pollution hotspots. Several schools, including Greystones Primary, are trialling closing streets at drop-off and pick-up times to keep children safe. Your candidate for Sheffield Council, Peter Gilbert, wants to see more done in our area: "Nobody wants to breathe dirty air. But most of us are still tied to transport that actually makes us sick. Air pollution is the single biggest environmental threat to health in the UK, shortening tens of thousands of lives each year. What would help us change?"

#### **A NEW KIND OF SHEFFIELD COUNCIL** CO-OPERATION AND NEW IDEAS WITH THE GREENS

In May, the people of Sheffield **voted for change**. The council is now led by a co-operative of Green and Labour councillors. Lib Dems were invited to join the co-operative but chose not to. The **It's Our City** referendum victory will also make the council more democratic with a modern committee system starting soon.

In committing the Council to **Net Zero carbon emissions by 2030** and a **Clean Air Zone**, our 13 Green councillors have already made a big impact. Candidate Peter Gilbert said, "It is great that every councillor can now have more of an impact after the referendum, I look forward to standing up for our area in this new kind of Council.
