FAIR PAY FOR A FAIRER CITY

The pandemic has been tough for all of us, with many in Ecclesall Ward relying on deliveries. Couriers have helped us through. Yet, just as the cost of living increases, Sheffield's Just Eat couriers are being hit with a 24% pay cut. They fought back with what has become the UK's longest running gigeronomy strike.

Ecclesall Green council election candidate Peter Gilbert has been speaking up for these key workers at demonstrations and pickets. He said, "I have been a delivery driver myself. It's a sector staffed disproportionately by black and minority ethnic employees and it is exploitative. Supporting them is a question of social justice."

BETTER BUSES

Connecting Sheffield: Abbeydale Road and Ecclesall Road is a plan to boost public transport in the southwest of Sheffield, with buses given priority at traffic lights and improvements made to junctions and roundabouts.

A public consultation on these plans was carried out. The consultation also asked for feedback on **initial ideas** to change bus lane times and parking enforcement.

Our candidate Peter Gilbert has been listening to local residents' views and hearing the concerns of business owners. Peter arranged a meeting between Ecclesall Road businesses and Green Councillor Douglas Johnson, Executive Member for Climate Change, Environment and Transport.

The Council are considering over 3,000 responses to the plans and initial ideas. They are also interviewing shoppers and conducting parking surveys along Ecclesall Road and Abbeydale Road to better understand the impact of any possible changes. Further public consultation will take place on any specific designs.



GREEN VOTES MAKE A DIFFERENCE

For a long time many would-be Green voters in Ecclesall have felt obliged to vote tactically in the two horse race between red and yellow. Not any more. As can be seen from the graph, the Green Party were neck and neck with Labour in 2021.

The number of Green councillors has been steadily increasing in Sheffield. There are now thirteen, with three holding Executive posts in the Labour and Green co-operative administration. Greens secured agreement with Labour that posts would be held open for the Lib Dems but they declined to take on the responsibility.

A vote for the Green Party is no longer a "wasted vote". Your vote could be the one that elects Ecclesall's first Green councillor!

From scientists, celebrity gardeners and conservationists, the message is clear: nothing justifies the use of peat based compost.

Peatlands form over thousands of years. They cover just 3% of the world's surface, yet hold 30% of the carbon stored in soil. Digging them up releases CO2 and causes climate change.

Peter is passionate about this issue as his partner Julia is an expert on peatlands. Together they are working with Green Peers in the House of Lords to pressure the Government to bring forward the ban on peat sales

What you can do now!

Go peat-free. There are now good alternatives. Peter was in touch with Bents Green Nurseries, which confirmed they stock peat-free compost. As the BBC's top gardener Monty Don says, "It is time for every gardener to play their part and ditch peat." All we are saying is Give Peat a Chance!
