CLEARING THE AIR

Sheffield's Clean Air Zone (CAZ) will go live from Monday 27th February.

It covers the inner ring road and city centre.

Green councillors have campaigned on air quality for many years because it contributes to 500 early deaths a year in Sheffield alone. Despite improvements in vehicle technology, air pollution levels are still at illegal levels in parts of the city centre.

Cllr Douglas Johnson said "As Executive Member in 2021, I pushed for a firm decision on the CAZ so that millions of

pounds of grants could be unlocked to upgrade polluting buses, taxis and vans. The 2021 Census shows that only 57% of households in City Ward have a car."

As part of the CAZ, a new bus gate is planned for Arundel Gate, which will also improve road safety and bus reliability and help to create a high quality public space.

Sheffield's Green group of 14 councillors The Green group have made significant progress in the council, working to make Sheffield fairer, safer and more sustainable. We have:

- Passed a renewable energy motion to commit the council to look into renewable energy installations on council owned buildings and new buildings.
- Passed an amendment on period poverty which focuses on the provision of free sanitary products in public buildings such as libraries and community centres.
- Proposed a cost of living working group in the council. A package of support is now available to anyone in need and a network of Welcome Places has been created.
- Contributed to the **Local Plan** through cross-party work, Greens steered the council to publishing a draft local plan for new buildings for the next 15 years.
- Acted on clean air Greens have steered and supported the implementation of a Clean Air Zone, which has released millions of pounds in grants to support taxi drivers and small businesses.
