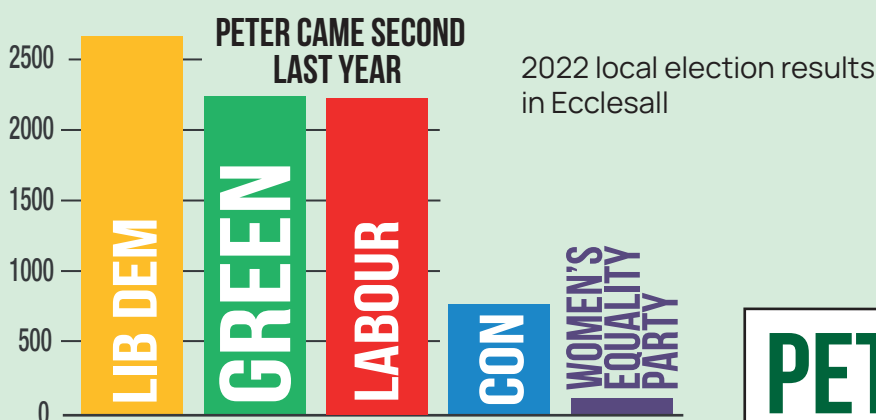

TREE PROTESTERS VINDICATED

Green councillors secured an independent inquiry into the needless felling of healthy street trees. The report identifies “serious and sustained failure of strategic leadership” in the Labour and Lib Dem administrations.

Peter said, “My family and I were active in the campaign to save Sheffield’s trees. Fighting for truth and justice was very emotional and I was even assaulted while peacefully protesting.”

“Greens were the only party that objected to outsourcing the work which cost taxpayers £2.2 billion. The PFI contract was negotiated by the Lib Dems, then Labour, behind closed doors. “If it wasn’t for Greens securing the inquiry, the truth would not be exposed. I am pleased the actions of campaigners have been vindicated and thank everyone who fought for nature and democracy.”

SAFER ROADS

Peter Gilbert and Ecclesall Greens want to see action on road safety like improved cycle routes, reduced speed limits and safer junctions.



6 months ago, local resident Adrian Lane was tragically killed whilst riding his bike on Ringinglow Road at the junction with Common Lane. His family and friends have launched The Lane Campaign to make cycling safer on the stretch of road where he died.
