

SAFER STREETS AND BETTER BUSES

Ash and Bernard have been talking to residents about the traffic calming measures in Walkley.

Government funding was received for implementing the safer neighbourhood schemes in this area, this includes new secure bicycle storage, which will be installed soon.

Green councillors secured an independent inquiry into the needless felling of healthy street trees. The report identifies "serious and sustained failure of strategic leadership" in the Labour administration at the time.
