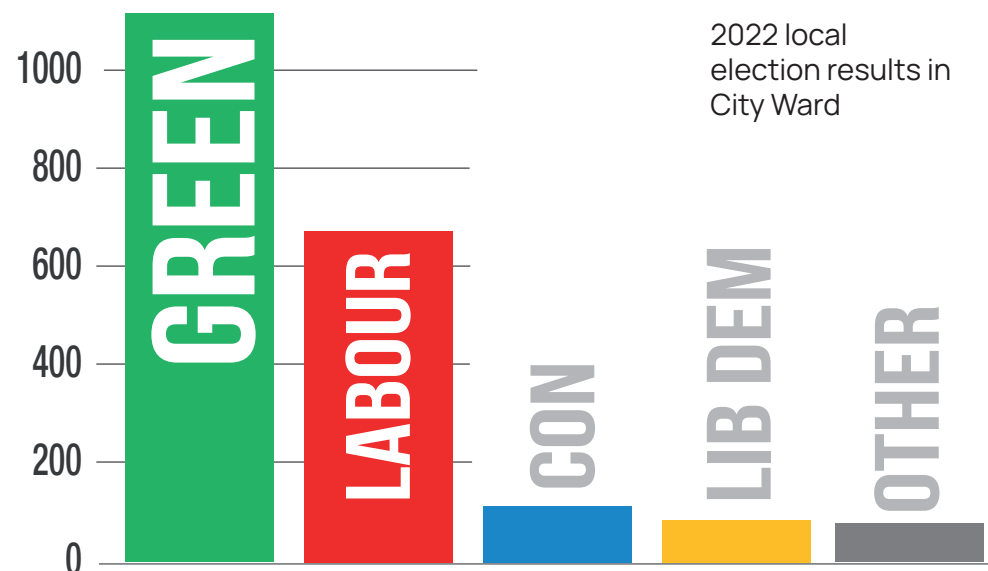

Ruth, Martin and Douglas are part of the Green group of 14 councillors, working both in our communities and on the Council. This year, we have committed the council to;

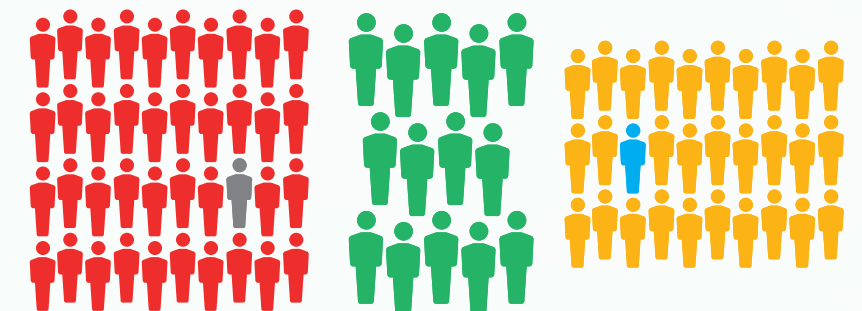
- **renewable energy** installations on council buildings and new buildings
- a **cost of living** working group to create a network of Welcome Places
- secure funding for vital **advice services** to support people in times of need
- **reduce inequality** by providing funding to communities which need it most
- a **nature and biodiversity** working group to help tackle the nature emergency
- **protect vital public services** through the council's budget-setting

- look into **social care cooperatives** to address the social care crisis
- consider providing free sanitary products in public buildings to help with **period poverty**
- make **streets safer** for everyone, by supporting School Streets and 20mph zones in residential areas
- act on the Lowcock report after securing the **independent inquiry into street tree felling**

Since Labour lost overall control in 2021, the parties are forced to work together.

The Lowcock report into the needless felling of healthy street trees is a stark reminder that the lack of transparency, openness and honesty in the previous Labour administration was catastrophic for our city.

Keeping the Council in no overall control is better for open and transparent decision making.
