

DGRESS ON PINSTONE STREET

Work is finally underway in the city centre to create better routes to walk and cycle. This important phase will join the city centre with Kelham Island and Neepsend, via Broad Lane and Townhead Street.

Cllr Douglas Johnson said,

"As well as better and safer routes, the work includes planting and features to make the environment more pleasant. The city centre will benefit from more colour and nature, like the hugely successful grey-togreen projects on Castlegate."

"When I was the lead member for transport in 2021, we fought off opposition from Labour and LibDems to see these projects through. The projects have successfully attracted millions of pounds from central government and I'm pleased to see the changes happening. They will help make the city centre sustainable for the future.'

West Bar roundabout and Shalesmoor are also benefiting from similar work to make the area more attractive. West Bar roundabout is being re-designed and a new crossing over the ring road will help connections to and from Kelham Island.
