TRAMLINES AND HILLSBOROUGH PARK


Tramlines is loved by many local residents. But Hillsborough Park became a mud-bath in July. **Restoring the park will take months and restrict access until late October minimum.** We're seeing more extreme rainfall events in the climate emergency – this will happen again.

We view Hillsborough Park as a public asset for public recreation. It's important for our health and wellbeing. We're very concerned about the impact the required closure of large areas is having on park use and local businesses who rely on visitor numbers. We believe the economic and cultural benefits no longer outweigh the negative impacts combined with park damage risks. Consideration must now be given to finding suitable alternative venues in the Sheffield area. That may take time and it must be considered likely Tramlines will be in Hillsborough Park next year. If that happens, we are demanding:

SEPTEMBER/OCTOBER 2023

- A robust weather action plan that kicks in based on weather forecasts.
- More temporary surfacing and walkways during the festival to protect the park surface.
- Smaller capacity fewer than 40,000 attending would reduce damage risks and allow more areas to stay open for public use.
- No additional similar sized events the Arctic Monkeys' concerts were a joyful homecoming but risked similar damage and further restricted summer access.
- **Restore re-entry to all ticket holders** to help local residents and businesses.

Christine was at the unveiling of the **Holme Lane Community Garden** noticeboard funded by the **Hillsborough Togethe**r local businesses group.

BUS SERVICES IN CRISIS

The Labour Mayor for South Yorkshire, Oliver Coppard, is responsible for bus services - not Sheffield City Council. Local councillors have pushed hard for improvements after losing key services like the 52A to Wisewood and Loxley and the SL1/1A Supertram link. Replacements are infrequent and unreliable with no early morning, evening or Sunday services for many.

There is no good news. Faced with another big cut in government funding, Oliver Coppard has prioritised maintaining basic hourly services with no funds available to improve current services. The Zoom Beyond 18 to 21 travel pass for 80p single journeys is being axed. **The government is increasing the maximum single fare to £2.50 in November.**

The government refuses to recognise the massive impacts this downward spiral in bus services is having on local communities and economies as people struggle to get to work, shop, medical appointments and socialise. **We must get buses back under local control.** The previous Labour mayor finally started the legal process in March 2022 but Oliver Coppard is now making this a priority.
