

PROTECTING FROM GAMBLING HARM

Residents, public health professionals, police, charities and businesses were all concerned about a gambling arcade opening on Fargate.

Your Green Councillor Douglas Johnson spoke against the proposal and the application was not granted.

Cllr Johnson said, "A gambling arcade would only add to nuisance problems in the city centre.

Millions of pounds are being spent to upgrade Fargate, opening a slot machine arcade would damage this ambition.

It would also undermine the intense work done day-in, day-out by public services and local charities working with people in the city centre who are vulnerable.

In addition to that, the police confirmed that Fargate is a hotspot for for anti-social behaviour. Even the applicant told us that closing betting shops on Haymarket "improved" the area. The applicant claimed Fargate isn't a residential area but thousands of people live in the city centre now, many of them students who would be at risk. I am pleased the council has used its muscle to refuse a harmful application."

City Ward councillors have also objected to other gambling premises on **High St** and **Castle Square** because of the risks.

CAMP FOR GAZA

NEW GP HUB

Plans to move two city centre doctors' surgeries into a historic former bank are underway.

Mulberry and City GP practices, both currently located near Arundel Gate, will move to refurbished premises on Church Street opposite the Cathedral.

Cllr Douglas Johnson said,

"This move will provide more space for the two surgeries.

The building has particular interest for me as I was the legal caseworker who brought the court case forcing the Royal Bank of Scotland to admit wheelchair users to its flagship branch. It broke legal history when we secured an injunction in court under the Disability Discrimination Act."
