A new map of trees across the country has shown how areas across Sheffield lack trees.

Trees and other plants have benefits for blocking pollution, providing shade in hot weather, soaking up rain and being a home for wildlife. Just being around trees has been shown to reduce stress - they are healthy for us and the planet!

Often, only wealthy areas have the trees they need. Most areas in Ecclesall are lucky in having trees, though not all.

Murray Road in Greystones now has new street trees. People on the street organised a crowdfunder and planted 5 trees. Contact Peter if you want to know how your street can do this.

Peter has donated 5 fruit trees as part of **High Storrs School's new orchard**.

There is a community orchard planned by Friends of Carterknowle Park.

COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH

Community Speedwatch is a national initiative where proactive members of local communities join with the support and supervision of their local police to record vehicles that are speeding.

The owners of speeding vehicles are then contacted - first with a letter explaining the potential risks and consequences of dangerous driving, then if there are repeat offenders, with a visit from the local police.

In Ecclesall there is now a Community Speedwatch group to help make our roads safe. The priority is to increase safety on stretches of road where there are known risks. Peter Gilbert is helping

GOSPEL CHURCH DEVELOPMENT



Ecclesall Greens have submitted comments on the development of the Gospel Church site, adjoining Carterknowle Park, on Carterknowle Road.

The derelict site has become overgrown, becoming a much needed haven for local wildlife. The new development has good features, such as **green roofs** and new **hedgerow**, but more could be done to maintain nature corridors.

There is also a high flood risk on the site. Permeable parking and

rain-gardens have been recommended but they aren't yet part of the designs. Greens would like to see a commitment to **affordable housing** - a critical issue for **Millhouses** and wider Sheffield. This is a large development of 67 apartments and needs to justify its impact. The developer needs to follow the
