SAFER ROADS

A new consultation on safety improvements to Ecclesall Road and Ecclesall Road South has highlighted a lack of joined up thinking about safety. Our area needs a joined-up plan, with one key part being a crossing at the top of Carterknowle Road. Peter Gilbert, the new Green Party councillor for Ecclesall, said:

"Residents have been asking for a crossing here for years but there's nothing in the scheme. We know Carter Knowle Road is crossed by loads of kids getting to school and people going to the Silver Hill shops. We need a safe crossing to connect our neighbourhoods."

Traffic on Ecclesall Road is rarely above 20mph in the day but speeds along at night,

with people enjoying a night out risking life and limb. More crossings and 20mph zones would help. Recent collisions on Knowle Lane, amongst other areas, have highlighted how other roads also need slower traffic speeds and better enforcement. We need to get road safety joined up across our neighbourhood.

A NEW VOICE FOR ECCLESALL BEING AN



It's been busy! My maiden speech in Council called for politicians to stop scapegoating and dividing communities and called for reform of political advertising. I also proposed an amendment that has committed the Council to call for the UK to rejoin the EU. I stood alongside my fellow Green councillors to condemn the escalation of violence upon Gaza and Lebanon, calling for a boycott of Israeli products and companies.

Of course, most of my work in council is about our area. I've supported the Sheaf and Porter Trust in their fight for an accessible footpath along the River Sheaf, pushing developers to do better. I've argued that the park keeper's lodge in Endcliffe Park, to be leased

a new proposed café/bar, discussing issues with **late-night noise from local businesses**.

I'm working with fellow Green councillors on issues including the pedestrian crossing on Abbey Lane joining up Ecclesall Woods, which has funding agreed and preparation going ahead. I'm working with local campaigners opposing a big new MUGA at Ecclesall Primary school - a meeting of the planning committee was sympathetic to the campaign.

I'm still actively engaged with our Community Speed Watch group. Concern and frustration about speeding cars comes up regularly in Ecclesall. Although only a small number of people break the limit, we know it risks tragedy for children and adults just wanting to cross a road. That's one reason why I wanted this newsletter to highlight the consultation about making Ecclesall Road safer.

BEING AN ANTI-RACIST NEIGHBOURHOOD



How can you make sure your neighbours feel welcome when they might feel isolated? Local mum and Green activist Tessa Lupton chalked messages on the pavement with her children. She says, "after seeing how the rioting had affected people I wanted to show people who might be feeling threatened or worried that our community supports them. We had some lovely comments from people passing by and the kids loved doing it". From street chalking to WhatsApp groups to local groups on Facebook, try to connect and keep yourself connected.
