The council voted last year in favour of Sheffield being a pedestrian friendly city. However during the start of January heavy snow and ice blanketed our pavements and cycle lanes and yet while AMEY cleared the roads the pavements remained treacherous for pedestrians. Cllr Maleiki Haybe during the height of the cold snap went with volunteers from Broomhall to help out gritting up the steep streets around Sharrow Vale.

## SPRINGFIELD PRIMARY SCHOOL UPDATE:

Sheffield City Council has approved the permanent closure of Springfield Nursery, following a thorough consultation process.

While this change marks the end of the nursery's operation, it also creates a new opportunity for the community. Cllr Maleiki Haybe strongly advocated for the Springfield Nursery space to be repurposed for community benefit rather than left unused of which 90% of the consultation respondents supported this vision.

Recognising the importance of accessible local services, he pushed for the site to be transformed into a hub for family support, early years learning/SEND, and health workshops. Your Voice Matters.

Councillor Haybe remains committed to ensuring local spaces serve the people who need them most.

## FOOD BANK HELP

Broomhill and Sharrow Vale Greens have been working with Ecclesall Greens to run a stall for the S6 Food Bank, collecting much needed items and money.
