to identify areas to focus on. Residents receive flyers in advance and the skip days bring together local communities, working in partnership with the council and GV TARA to look after Gleadless Valley."



GREENS SAY AUSTERITY IS A POLITICAL CHOICE

Sheffield Green Councillors have called for an end to austerity and for the Government to address inequality. **Councillor Alexi Dimond** proposed a motion to council, saying; "We need to **tax wealth not work** - a modest 1% tax on those with assets over £10 million and 2% tax on those with assets over a billion."

Greens call on the Government to **invest in good quality council housing**, with funding for repairs and new homes and to begin undoing the decades of underinvestment.

LEAF CLEARANCE

Residents on streets with trees have asked for **leaf clearance** due to slippy pavements.

The council has a 'Streets Ahead' agreement with contractor 'Amey' - this was agreed by Labour and LibDems and does not include regular leaf clearance.

Your Green councillors have raised this in council because it is hazardous, particularly on streets with a gradient like Lismore Road, Stanley Road and Upper Albert Road in Meersbrook.

Clir Paul Turpin said "Even though leaf clearance isn't included in the contract I have worked to ensure that hotspots are dealt with where leaves block the drains and cause a flood risk."

Clir Marieanne Elliot is pushing for regular clearance on streets with a gradient to be prioritised for **safety** reasons.
