GREENS OPPOSE PLANS TO AXE COMMITTEE SYSTEM

Shared decision-making better reflects voters' views

Green Councillors have condemned plans by the Labour Government to abolish the Council's Committee System.

Labour are proposing to overrule the will of Sheffielders, who overwhelmingly voted four years

ago to abolish the unrepresentative Cabinet System which served Sheffield so badly. The committee system has led to improved cross-party working and better outcomes for our city, particularly now the Council has no Party with a majority. Under the Committee System all 84 elected councillors make decisions, not just a very small group.

20 MILE PER HOUR ZONE FOR ECCLESALL ROAD

Green councillors have backed plans for new twenty-mile per hour zones on sections of Ecclesall Road. The move will cut speeding and incidents, promote more walking and cycling and give shoppers and diners on the popular road a more pleasant experience.

The changes are part of the Council's plan for better, safer and more sustainable travel options, less congestion and cleaner air.

Statistics show that Ecclesall Road is one of the most dangerous A-roads in the country. The road is crossed by many children.

The changes will be funded by central government.

BIKE HANGARS FOR BROOMHILL AND SHARROW VALE

Local Green Party councillors are backing a pilot scheme that allows cyclists to park their bikes on their street in



secure hangars. Residents around the city will be able to rent a space in one of twelve planned cycle hangars for £72 per year per user. This follows a successful pilot of eight hangars in the Crookes/Walkley area and others in Gleadless Valley.

Councillor Brian Holmshaw says: 'Your Local Green councillors have funded extra bike parking in Broomhill and Sharrow Vale. Now it's time to install secure storage hangars close to houses. Many homes in the ward are small and only have back yards, so storage is difficult. Residents have called for close-by bike storage.' The hangars take up half the space of a single car, and most will be off-street. If you are interested make a request to transport@sheffield.gov.uk by 31st December, or contact local ward councillors.

GREENS SUPPORT PLANS TO LINK CITY TOGETHER

Local Green Party councillors back plans to improve links to the city centre and make it easier to move around on foot, by bike or on public transport.

The Council's Access and Movement Plan will mean cleaner air and make the city a more pleasant place to visit. Work is underway following a public consultation that found support for a more sustainable city.

In future, more people will live in the city centre, boosting growth and creating new jobs. Work has already begun on making the centre safer for pedestrians.

With forecasts of more people entering the city, the plans aim to reduce traffic congestion by promoting alternative ways to travel, by bus, tram or active travel such as cycling or walking.
