We know our work is valued by the community too, which is a massive boost."

MORE FUNDING FOR HIGHFIELD | SHARROW COMMUNITY **LIBRARY DELIVERED!**

Councillor Maroof Raouf recently supported the release of additional funding for CCTV at Highfield Library. Explaining why this is important for the community, Maroof said: "Having this installed outside the library will be a vital step in ensuring the safety of visitors, especially as the darker months set in. Often used by children, older residents, and vulnerable individuals, I was very keen that the area surrounding it should feel safe and welcoming".

COUNCIL SHOULD ACT ON CHILD POVERTY!

Councillor Raouf has called on Labour to urgently address child poverty. The Labour Government's own statistics show 100,000 more children in poverty than last year, with a total of 4.5 million children in poverty. Speaking at full council, Maroof made the case on how successive Governments' lack of action has hurt Nether Edge and Sharrow: "Hundreds in Nether Edge & Sharrow live in hardship. These aren't numbers; they're my neighbours, my classmates, and my colleagues. They are my brothers and my sisters. They are wonderful people failed by systems that should have protected them. Poverty is not inevitable. It's the result of choices by governments that lack empathy. And we in Sheffield must choose differently!"

ADVENTURE PLAYGROUND OPENING

The new Adventure Playground at Mount Pleasant Park opened in July to a great reception. Councillor Raouf was at the opening and welcomed the new playground with open arms:

"I was very happy to take part in the opening of the new Adventures building. This wonderful modern building will create a safe space for growth and give our young voices a place to be heard. I will continue to advocate for improving the surrounding area with better lighting, improvement of the green spaces, and pushing for the whole community to feel more connected and empowered".
